Black History Month Workshop

Knowing ME knowing YOU

Community Cohesion is an opportunity to welcome and understand others. It calls upon our experiences and willingness to learn by identifying our similarities and our differences. How we relate to others says much about the nature and strength of our community.

African Jewellery Making

A fun hands-on workshop lasting one session and suitable for all age groups. Attendees learn about the different materials used to make jewellery by ancient and modern African people and try their hand at creating their own designs. All jewellery made on the day is kept by the students.

Acting up

A drama-based community cohesion workshop that lasts 1.5 hours and is suitable for young people between the ages of 13 to 19.

The workshop is arranged so that learners have the opportunity to improvise a number of pre-designated scenarios that enable them to inhabit other people's lives within the community. Scenarios will examine the role of the individual within a community and then look at their collective role as part of a wider group.

After each improvisation learners have the opportunity to stop and consider the drama, its outcomes and discuss the positive and negative emotions generated. The ability to empathise with opposing community groups, create dialogue for understanding and ultimately create solutions for resolving conflict is key.

Caribbean Cooking Lessons

In this workshop, students will learn about Caribbean cuisine from the island of Jamaica, through a cooking class. The classes will provide students with three unique experiences: they will learn to cook, practice their vocabulary, and improve their reading and writing skills by creating a menu and a cookbook.

We recommend this hands-on method of teaching because it is a fun and easy way to encourage children to develop an interest in cooking.

During the lessons that follow, We explain how I will increase the children's knowledge of Caribbean culture, traditions, history and geography.



Outcomes

Participants benefit from a range of transferable skills including:

- Increased confidence
- Improved manual dexterity
- A raised awareness of design principles
- Enhanced pre-planning and creative skills

In addition, a number of these core elements can form the foundation of enterprise training where individuals explore opportunities to become economically active by selling their crafts.

Schedule

The sessions last between 45mins- 3 hours and can be delivered over days, weeks, or months. Learners typically attend training once per week. However programmes can be adapted to suit specific requirements.
